Leaf Pick Up

Hampden Township will be picking up leaves every Friday starting October 8th, and continuing until Thanksgiving Day. Please rake your leaves into the street with about a foot between your leaf pile and the curb so that the machine can properly pick up the leaves. Also, do not park near the leaf pile since it is difficult for the machines to suck them up when you park too close. Finally, please do not put sticks, metal or yard waste in the leaf pile as that will jam the expensive machines.

Street and Stop Signs: Changes Coming

Federal laws regarding street signs and road safety are starting to impact our residential streets. Have you noticed our new STOP signs...they have enhanced reflective coatings and are designed to new break-away standards. The Westover Civic Association, under the direction of John Reiersen, Zone Director, has started to assess the impact on Westover of a government mandated regulation requiring municipalities to change traffic and street sign designs in the future.

Hampden Township official, Glenn MaGatz, met with the Westover Civic Association Board recently to report on design changes. Westover's beautiful wooden street signs won't meet the new standards, required in a few years.

Our current options are to have the Township replace all of our signs at no direct cost to Westover (but expensive to say the least) or for the Westover Civic Association to replace our posts and signs with a new break-away design. We will keep you posted as this project moves forward.

There is no mention of the direction of the boards, but general practices dictate that the good side is your neighbor's side and you get the framework.

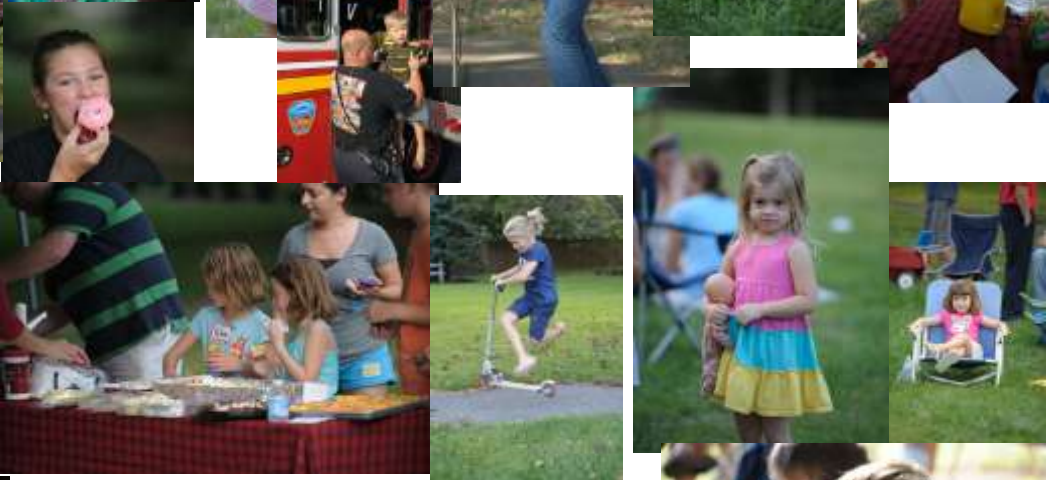
Westover End of Summer Block Party

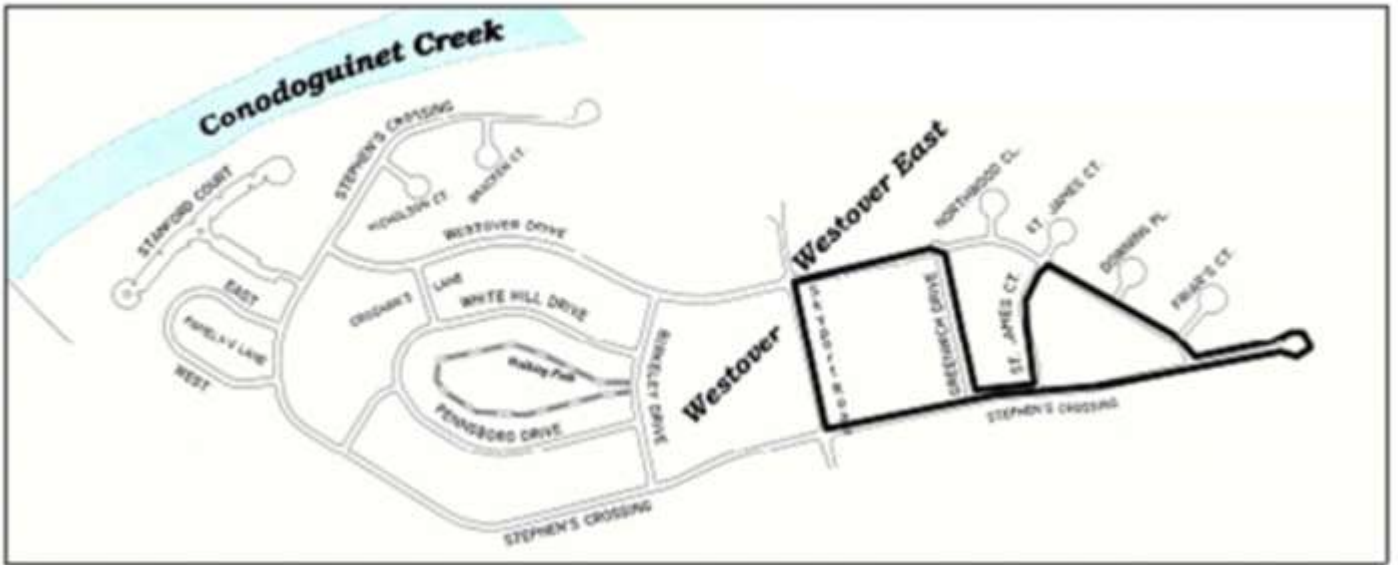
