McCord Commons Construction Update

Sam Craig, Chairman of the McCord Commons Improvement Committee, tells us that the work is well on the way for paving of the walkways, additional bench pads, additional benches and new landscaping around the new benches. The committee is made up of Sam Craig, Joe Washburn, Ed Deaton, Ed Reynolds, Greg Hartman, Joe Farrell and ex officio member Susan Skender. Hampden Township has been most helpful in both the design and construction of the project. Sam tells us that the project should be completed in time for the Summer in the Park series.

Sam Craig, the ultimate party animal, has announced that there will be a bush and flower planting party for the new walkways on both July 7 and July 14. The party starts promptly at 8:30 am and will last about two hours. Please bring a shovel, rake and a small hand digger.











Sergeant Shissler, Hampden Police Department

Lots of news from Sergeant Shissler this quarter. First of all, the home burglaries are really happening and this is modus operandi: The bad

guys look to see if someone is leaving for work, then they wait for the spouse to leave and then they act. They almost always go through the garage door, into the garage and then into the house. They typically take jewelry and small items of value. Sergeant Shissler asks that you lock all doors even if you take the dog for a walk or run over to the neighbors. This is a big problem this year in Hampden Township.

There are four bike patrol officers this summer and you will see them around and about in Westover, so keep an eye

out for them.


Fitness in Westover

Cindy Magnuski, Manager of Gold's Gym in Camp Hill and a long time Westover resident, tells us that fitness in Westover is the very best place (well almost, Gold's is still the best) to walk and jog. The streets are safe and we are so fortunate to have sidewalks throughout Westover and we even have handicap cut outs for all the corners.

Cindy tells us that in this hot weather it is super important to drink lots of water and then some more after any walking or jogging. It is critical to re-hydrate after exercise. It is also important to eat about an hour before your walk and after your walk; eat something that has protein to help replenish the muscles. If walking at night or in the early am, it is very important to have a reflector on your body so motorists can see you.

"The trail maps that Westover provides are a great way for you to measure your distance so that you can constantly be adding just a little bit each time till you reach the goal you have set for yourself, according to **Cindy**. 



Fitness Trails




