Please Be Aware -- Westover Remodeling Scam

Recently a team of peddlers promoting window replacement and remodel-

ing services has been working in our neighborhood. There have been concerns with this group not being licensed and becoming quite nasty to deal with. Thanks to the help of concerned Westover residents, the police are following up on this most recent incident.

If you are approached by someone selling services or products, that does not have a license to do so, please contact the Hampden Township Police (761-2609) or (238-9676 after hours). If the peddler is aggressive and you feel threatened, call 911. While many of these folks are hard working and diligent, there are those that are not, and we caution you to be aware.

Hampden Township Ordinances

CHAPTER 13—LICENSES, PERMITS AND GENERAL BUSINESS REGULA-TIONS, PART 1 SOLICITING AND PED-DLING LICENSES

§108. LICENSE TO LIST PROD-UCTS.

Such license when issued shall state, inter alia, the products to be sold or services to be rendered by the licensee. Every solicitor or peddler shall at all times, when engaged in soliciting or peddling in the Township of Hampden, carry such license upon his person and shall exhibit it upon request, to all police officers, Township officials and citizens. No solicitor or peddler shall engage in selling any product or service not mentioned on such license.

Chief Harry Clay meets with Westover Board

Chief Clay met with the Westover Board on June 9th to introduce himself to the community. Chief Clay has been active in the Township Police for 31 years and brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to serve all of the township residents. Some of the highlights of his visit were as follows:

The township has 23 officers on staff and two new police vehicles. The total vehicles are 6 marked cars, a criminal investigation van and some unmarked cars. Chief Clay asks your help by calling the police when you see things happening so they can deal with them immediately; they have four certified seat specialists who will help you install and properly fit a child seat (call 761-2609 for an appointment); he has started a police blotter to keep the public informed (see article on the front page of this issue) and they are actively working on aggressive stop sign runners.

Chief Clay told the board that garage door hoppers are very active (recently caught one group and have the lead on another right now). He requested all of us to **PLEASE** keep your garage doors down. This is an invitation to kids (especially if they see a refrigerator which may mean beer) and other thieves. So close your garage door.

These are just a few of the items he mentioned, and we are pleased that the Westover Civic Association and the Police Department have this open channel of communication.

Dear Westover Willie

Q. I keep banging my head on tree limbs so what are you going to do about it?



A. While I do not have this problem as I am way above you guys, I know what you mean. You see some folks do not trim their trees to the Hampden Township required 8 foot height. This is a real problem as it forces walkers and joggers onto the street which is not a safe place to walk. The problem is further aggravated in that branches stick down and can and have poked folks in the eye. **So trim the trees over the sidewalks to 8 feet.**

Q. Dog poop again?

A. Yes, I know and I am deep into this issue as always. Did you know that I got 1,876,712 requests in 2009 for folks to pick up poop? Yep, I did and this year is looking up to be a tight race. So please if you see a dog pooping and the owner not picking up, offer them a newspaper plastic bag. If it gets really stinky, then call the Hampden Township Police as they will help enforce the township law.

Q. Why grass is dying, what should I do?

Short answer is pray for rain. But most likely it is not dead, but just dormant and will come back. You should not fertilize it as that will hurt rather than help and if we get a few inches of rain then do not water it. If you do find a spot or two where the grass has actually died, then plant new seed in the middle of September but not before then. Wise Ole' Willie knows a lot

So What are the Electric Trucks Doing in Westover?



protect them for the long term.

Recently there have been electrical trucks in Westover and you may be wondering what they are doing?

Westover is over 30 years old and PP&L, the neighborhood's electric company, is evaluating the health of the underground electrical feeds to the local transformers near the homes. Some of the cables can deteriorate over time, and if they detect this with their equipment they have marked them for replacement. For those lines that are tested AOK, they inject a fluid into the cables to disperse any water to better

These transformers have 7,200 volts of electricity in them (you have 220 volts in your house), so they can be very dangerous if one were to tamper with them.

The workers pointed out why it is so important to keep shrubs and bushes away from the front of the units. They need unfettered access so that when they open them, they can get to the wires safely without limbs and leaves falling into the units,

possibly causing a short.

OTHER NEWS FOR WESTOVER RESIDENTS

Checking and Monitoring the Oak Trees in Westover

The Westover Civic Association has asked the Pa Department of Forestry Services to check and monitor the oak trees in Westover due to the weakening condition. Mr. Zack Roeder, a forester with DCNR, reviewed the trees in 2009 and again in 2010. His report is below. His final analysis is that the trees are getting aged and will start to show signs of distress when in an urban environment with paved streets, sidewalks and houses. There is not much that can be done other than keeping a lookout for disease as he mentions.

Here is his report:

I didn't find anything new or suspicious. I asked the Forest Pest Management Division for input and they greed. There were no insect or disease causing problems. Landscape trees have to deal with a lot of stress, and those oaks are no exception. The insects and disease in those situations are typically opportunistic, taking advantage of a weakened tree. However, it is important to monitor for new infestations, gypsy moth in particular. Drought is out of anyone's control but mulch would be preferable to turf, and deep watering is helpful when it does get exceptionally dry. Watering small amounts frequently might do more harm than good. While iron injections can help chlorotic trees, it is only a temporary fix, and arguably more of an aesthetic concern than anything else. Pruning to remove dead or disease branches and thinning as needed can be beneficial. As the trees age they become less and less resilient. Dead trees and trees that are severely declining should be removed. Planting site appropriate species with diversity in mind makes community forests much less insect and disease prone and more resilient.

I noticed some sad looking ash trees in the area as well. I inspected them for Emerald Ash Borer and found none. Ash trees are often affected by Anthracnose, and native borers, and some of those ash had mechanical damage, so sad looking Ash trees are fairly common. EAB is currently in Bedford and Juniata Counties, so you should not plant ash trees and you should continue monitoring for EAB. Zachary Roeder




