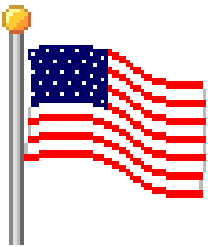
Q. What do you think about putting up little signs to indicate when lawn spraying takes place?

Village of Westover Flags



The Westover Civic Association board of directors is encouraging all residents of The Village of Westover to proudly display the American flag outside their residence between Memorial Day (May 31) and the 4th of July.

The board of directors is hopeful that most residents choose to make this display of patriotism and show a true spirit of unity in our community. Just like Christmas decorations, the final choice however remains with the residents.

The flag can be flown 24 hours a day if illuminated. Illuminating does not necessarily mean a spot light must be used. The light source must be enough to make the flag visible from the street.

If not illuminated, the American flag should only be flown from dawn to dusk. An all weather flag is recommended since then it will not be necessary to bring the flag indoors during times of inclement weather.

If your flag has seen better days, you are encouraged to "retire" your flag. The Boy Scouts, the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign War all have ceremonies to properly dispose of well used flags.

If your residence does not currently have a flag pole holder, flag kits or simply the flag pole holder can be purchased at a number of retail establishments including local hardware stores, Target and Walmart.

If you are unable to mount the post holder to the side of your residence, please email Matt Carnovale at matt.carnovale@fci.com. He is attempting to get a crew of Boy Scouts to assist with installation of flag pole holders on some Saturday in June. Saturday, June 12 is being considered since it is just before Flag Day (6/14). The resident will need to have on hand the hardware prior to the scheduled install date. If you are interested in some assistance, you will be notified by email of the planned date.

The board hopes you all choose to proudly display the American flag – not just Memorial Day to the 4th of July – but all year round.

Hampden Township Recycling Guidelines



Hampden Township recently updated the guidelines for what can and cannot be included in the recycling containers. Here is the list of what can be included:

- Aluminum food and beverage containers *
- Glass (clear, brown, green) food and beverage containers *
- Plastic containers with symbols 1 through and including 7 *
- Empty aerosol cans
- Corrugated cardboard - please flatten and cut into pieces no larger than 3- feet by 3-feet and bundle

* Please rinse and remove lids, labels do not need to be removed.

Please bundle or place the following items in **paper bags** and place in your recycle container

- Newsprint/Slick Inserts
- Construction paper, cereal and food boxes, paper

- towel rolls or similar
- Printer paper, computer paper, copy paper
- Junk mail
- Magazines and catalogs
- Telephone books

The following items **may not** be placed in recycle containers:

- Wax coated paper
- Materials with food debris
- Plastic bags
- Batteries
- Styrofoam
- Light bulbs
- Mirrors, window/auto glass, ceramics, cookware, bakeware, drinking glasses
- Wood
- Unnumbered plastics
- Coat hangers
- Appliances
- Hazardous or toxic substances

Updated Stop Signs in Township



Hampden is in the process of updating the stop signs to put the township in compliance with the State of PA PennDot guidelines. You will notice that the posts are new (breakaway design), include a reflective strip and the signs are new. The Westover Civic Association will be meeting with the Township regarding our street signs which also must be altered according to the government regulations. As you know we have wooden posts with very nice signage on top. We will keep you posted on any mandated changes.

Home Based Businesses in Hampden Township

This question comes up frequently since many folks now work from home. Hampden Township controls this and we reference you to ordinances (Chapter 27, Part 2, Definitions, No-Impact Home-Based business). Generally if you work from home and have no clients, customers or employees coming to your home office, then you are OK. If you have a home based business then you cannot have signage, stock inventory, have customers or clients visit, and you must comply with other township regulations.
