# **Good Hope Road Study**

Hampden Township has published the <u>Good Hope</u> Road Study Public Presentation and Draft Results.

This was a comprehensive study of the length of Good Hope Rd. from Erb's Bridge all the way to Wertzville Rd. Many Westover residents use this road, sometimes daily, for accessing healthcare, recreation, employment, or Interstate 81. Public comment is open through April 2nd.



# Westover Mailbag

Dear Westover Civic Association,

- Q: You send a lot of emails about dogs. What about cats that are outside? Sometimes my neighbor's cat is in our yard or causes property damage. Can you remind people to be responsible cat owners as well?
- A: Just like we publish with dog owners, the **Town**ship Codes define and outline rules for Other Animals in Hampden Township. Respectfully, we would recommend that you address any concerns about safety or property damage with the person(s) whose residence the cat (or other pet) calls home. We know this can be challenging as some prefer to avoid conflict. Discussion or negotiation can be helpful as the owner may not be aware of your concern. Hopefully, the owner will respond in a prompt and responsible manner. Contacting the township could be a last resort if the cat is causing damage or posing a threat to your pet or another person. You could also research humane deterrents to use in your yard as some do for other non-domesticated pests.

### Westover Willie



Dear Westover Willie,

- O: I went to a class with my mom at Wildwood Park in Harrisburg and learned about bird tracks. With snow and mud in the spring, it's a great time to look for tracks in your yard and shorten the list of possibilities by knowing local bird species. What more can you tell me?
- A: That sounds like a fun class! Yes, birds do leave tracks from walking, running, hopping, or skipping. Classic bird tracks are made by birds with feet that are anisodactyl, which is a foot where 3 toes are pointed forward and 1 is pointed backward. Birds you might see in Westover with these kinds of feet are practically all songbirds, herons, egrets, eagles, and hawks. My tracks are called zygodactyl, which means I have 2 toes in the front and 2 toes in the back. This helps me scramble up trees, grip branches, or capture prey. Woodpeckers have feet like mine too. If you're down by the Conodoguinet, you might see webbed tracks in the mud on the bank. This is an outline that stretches between the 3 front toes, and is found in ducks and geese. Speaking of geese, make sure your driver goes slowly on Erb's Bridge Road because those geese like to waddle across the roadway at all hours.
